**ONGOING FAITH WITNESS AGAINST HASSOCKFIELD:** In October, the Home Office plans to open an Immigration Removal Centre at Hassockfield on the site of the former Medomsley Detention Centre. This will be for 80 women seeking asylum in the UK. The proposal is inhumane, unjust and incompatible with our faith which calls us to recognise the intrinsic dignity of each person. These women are people like ourselves who have the right to a place of safety and to be treated with respect and compassion. **A monthly prayer vigil will be held at the barrier to Hassockfield on the first Sunday of each month at 3pm, the next one being on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October.** This will last for about 30 minutes and will incorporate a time of silent witness.
